

Somerset Collaborative Insights Hub

Introduction

Spark Somerset is leading a collaborative initiative with *All About The Place*, a specialist community informatics social enterprise, to develop the Somerset Collaborative VCFSE Insights Hub. This project is guided by a small steering group that includes the Community Council for Somerset and Somerset Activity and Sports Partnership—who originally proposed the idea—alongside Young Somerset and Somerset Community Foundation.

This document, along with the accompanying Microsoft Excel template, provides practical guidance and a standardised method for VCFSE organisations to share service output data. Submitted data will be processed and visualised through an interactive Microsoft Power BI dashboard to support shared insight and strategic learning.

Why We're Collecting Outcomes Data

Establishing a consistent approach to measuring outcomes is essential for demonstrating the tangible impact of the services delivered by Somerset's VCFSE sector. It enables organisations to clearly show how their resources are addressing community needs and delivering meaningful results, supporting accountability, learning, and continuous improvement.

What's in It for You

Adopting shared outcome measures offers clear benefits to individual organisations. It enhances transparency, builds trust with funders and partners, and boosts credibility with the public. It also supports internal reflection and learning, helping organisations better understand what works and why. Crucially, it provides strong, evidence-based narratives to underpin funding applications and strengthen partnership proposals.

By contributing your data to the Insights Hub, you also help lay the groundwork for developing shared impact and social value metrics. These can be used to showcase the broader value of your services and strengthen the case for future investment, commissioning opportunities, and long-term support.

Wider Strategic Benefit

By contributing to the central Insights Hub, local VCFSE organisations help build a collective evidence base that demonstrates the sector's overall impact. This shared intelligence supports stronger advocacy for funding, enables more joined-up responses to local needs, and fosters collaboration by identifying overlaps, gaps, and opportunities. It also helps organisations benchmark their work, show their value in context, and contribute to a more data-informed, community-driven approach to improving local wellbeing.



Collecting and Sharing Output Data

To begin with, please note that we are **not requesting any personal or identifiable information about individuals**. We are only seeking summary-level data drawn from your existing records.

Included with this document is a **Microsoft Excel template** that outlines the suggested structure and scope of the required data. This format is designed to help measure the scale and nature of service activity across the VCFSE sector and to support a better understanding of its collective impact.

If your organisation already uses a system to collect and report on service activity. In that case encourage you to align your output reporting with this template where possible, enabling the generation of outcomes data suitable for sharing with the Insights Hub.

For organisations without an existing system, the Excel template can be used as a simple data capture tool. You are welcome to adapt it by adding additional columns for your internal needs. However, please note that when submitting data to the Insights Hub, only the data items specified in the original template will be required.

Guidance:

- Ideally, we would like the data provided to be as granular as possible, i.e. one data row for each engagement, with a timestamp for when the engagement took place.
- We acknowledge that an engagement may be measured as a session, or a specific period, or perhaps as a total count of the number of persons engaged in an activity. All are acceptable measures.
- When it comes to time allocation to engagements, the data can be provided in decimal format, i.e. 0.80 for a fifty-minute session, 1.00 for an hour, or 1.50 for an hour and a half, etc.
